ENEMO GA 2017



On 6-7 April Tbilisi hosted the General Assembly of ENEMO 2017.

The members of the network reviewed the previous year and discussed the opportunities for 2017.

The GA voted for the new composition of the Secretariat and the Secretary General. The Secretary General of ENEMO for 2017-2019 is Center for monitoring and Research (CeMI) - Montenegro, represented by Zlatko Vujovic. Other members of the Secretariat are Coalition for Democracy and Civil Society - Kyrgyzstan; GOLOS - Russia; International Society for Fair Elections and Democracy (ISFED) - Georgia; Kriik-Albania - Albania.

New Member Organizations



The Assembly also voted on membership of new organizations.

Kosovo Democratic Institute (KDI) became a full member organization after two years of being associate member.

The GA as well voted for the membership of new organizations from Serbia and Armenia: Center for Research, Transparency and Accountability ([CRTA](#)) and Armenian organization—Transparency International Anticorruption Center ([TIAC](#)) became the associate member organizations of ENEMO.

LTO Training in Tbilisi



During 8-10 April, Tbilisi hosted two parallel [trainings](#) of ENEMO Long Term Observers. The trainings gathered 32 participants from 21 member organizations.

The training was third of its kind, while previous trainings took place in Tbilisi during September, 2016 and in Chisinau during November, 2016.

The training aims at standardizing ENEMO long term observation methodology and creating a pool of trained observers for the upcoming missions.

Final Report of EOM in Moldova



On 24 February, 2017 ENEMO released its final report of the ENEMO election observation mission to the Presidential Elections 2016 in Moldova.

The mission was composed of six core team members, ten teams of short-term observers (STOs) for the first round of elections and four teams of STOs for the second round of elections, with additional five STOs in the polling stations established in three countries abroad (Romania, Russian Federation and Ukraine).

The [report](#) covers some crucial aspects of the electoral process, such as, conduct of election administration bodies, with focus on the Central Election Commission (CEC) and Precinct Election Bureaus (PEB); legal framework; handling of complaints and appeals; media conduct; as well as the overall socio-political background in which the elections took place.
